Vocabulary	Definition	Origin
Civilisation	<i>(noun)</i> the action of buying and selling goods and services.	from Old French <i>calendier</i> "list, register," from Latin <i>calendarium</i> "account book," from <i>calendae/kalendae</i> "the calends" the first day of the Roman month, when debts fell due and accounts were reckoned.
Trade	<i>(noun)</i> the art or practice of designing and constructing buildings.	from Latin <i>civilis</i> ("civil"), related to <i>civis</i> ("citizen") and <i>civitas</i> ("city")
Topography	<i>(noun)</i> the arrangement of the natural and artificial physical features of an area.	from medieval Latin <i>contemporarius</i> , from <i>con</i> 'together with' + <i>tempus, tempor-</i> 'time'
Contemporary	<i>(noun)</i> a chart or series of pages showing the days, weeks, and months of a particular year, or giving particular seasonal information.	Derived from <i>architectus</i> from Greek <i>arkhitektōn</i> , related to <i>arkhi-</i> 'chief' + <i>tektōn</i> 'builder'.
Architecture	<i>(noun)</i> the stage of human social and cultural development and organization that is considered most advanced	from Greek <i>topographia</i> "a description of a place," from <i>topos</i> "place" + <i>-graphia</i> "process writing or recording"
Calendar	<i>(noun)</i> living or occurring at the same time.	from Middle Low German, literally 'track', of West Germanic origin; related to tread.
