



Practice regularly.</p> <p>Learn your times tables as many ways as you can.</p> <p>We will have a weekly tables challenge in class.</p> <p>You need to know up to 12 x 12 and their division facts too</p> <p>BE READY!</p>	<p>Spelling</p> <p>Children will have their spelling bees.</p> <p>Practise your termly spellings by writing them in lots of different ways. Focus on 2-4 each week. Can you use different objects around the house to make the words? Make your own word cards and decorate them.
