Remember remember the 5 th of November! Guy Fawkes was born on 13th April 1570, in York. His Catholic religion was very important to him but, at that time, King James I did not like people being Catholic in England. He went to war in Europe to fight on behalf of Spain, which was a Catholic country. He called himself 'Guido' instead of Guy and became an officer. When he came back to England, he became involved in a plot to kill King James I. A group of men, led by Robert Catesby, wanted Guy Fawkes to be involved partly because he understood how to use gunpowder, which is very explosive and dangerous. This was their Gunpowder Plot.
